AGREEMENT FOR SALE OF CHINOOK DOG

This Agreement for Sale of Chinook Dog ("Agreement") dated _____, 2001 is between the kennel above ("Breeder") and _____ ("Purchaser") whose address is _____. Your Chinook puppy, whelped September 14, 2001, is described as "this Chinook."

The welfare of this Chinook and the Chinook breed are of primary importance to the Breeder. During his lifetime, Perry Greene required persons interested in buying a Chinook to wait many years and then spend the night in Waldoboro with the intended Chinook to ensure the Chinook's approval of its new owner. Instead of waiting years and spending the night in Waldoboro, this Agreement seeks to ensure placement of a Chinook in a loving, stable, lifetime home with responsible owners. Such responsibilities include protecting against indiscriminate breeding. Purchaser agrees to assume such responsibility during this Chinook's entire life.

This Chinook is guaranteed to be healthy and current on all vaccinations at the time of sale. At the time of delivery of this Chinook, you will receive documentation of your puppy's shots and a health certificate. Purchaser has one week from the date of delivery in which to have this Chinook checked by a licensed veterinarian and is urged to do so. If the veterinarian finds this Chinook to be unhealthy, the Chinook may be returned to the Breeder within 48 hours of the examination. Purchaser must provide to Breeder a letter by the veterinarian verifying the diagnosis. The purchase price (\$xxxxx) will be refunded upon timely return of this Chinook. Any expense incurred in the return of the Chinook will be borne by Purchaser including the cost of any travel expenses and veterinarian bills.

Purchaser agrees to keep this Chinook in healthy condition and in a safe environment, ensuring that this Chinook:

(1) receives ample high quality food, fresh water, and exercise appropriate for its age and working conditions;

(2) is provided ample space and opportunity to expend excess energy;

(3) is not allowed to run free without adequate supervision and control;

(4) receives routine preventative and necessary emergency veterinary care including, but not limited to, annual physical examination, screening for parasites, vaccinations, treatment necessary due to local conditions (such as heartworm and Lyme disease), and rabies vaccinations as required by state law.

(5) receives proper socialization to people and animals through puppy kindergarten and one class of basic obedience.

(6) Purchaser understands that the Chinook is a very social and family oriented animal that requires constant contact with its family. In purchasing this Chinook it is understood that this dog will be a permanent house dog and never chained or left outside on a continuous basis.

Purchaser also agrees to spay/neuter this Chinook at a reasonable age as determined by Purchaser's vet but at a date no later than 14 months from the date of birth. Once a copy of the spay/neuter certificate is received by the Breeder a refund in the amount of \$200 will be sent to the Purchaser.

In the event that this Chinook becomes an unwanted member of the Purchaser's home, the Breeder shall be notified and have first option to take possession of the Chinook. In the event that this Chinook is returned to the Breeder, the Breeder shall retain all money paid for this Chinook. Purchaser may not sell, gift or give this Chinook to another person without the prior notification and written approval of the Breeder. The new owner of this Chinook must be willing to abide by the terms of this Agreement.

All large breeds are susceptible to a condition called "hip dysplasia" but, according to conventional wisdom, with careful monitoring breeders may control this problem. This puppy was whelped of parents who are both certified free of hip dysplasia by the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) and the Institute for Genetic Disease Control (GDC). Purchaser is required, regardless of intention to breed this Chinook, to have this Chinook's hips x-rayed and submitted to the OFA after its second birthday or GDC after its first birthday. Breeder requests OFA and/or GDC x-rays as Purchaser's contribution to strengthening the Chinook breed. At a time near your puppy's first birthday, Breeder will send you literature providing more detail regarding this request. The Breeder also strongly encourages the Purchaser to permanently identify its Chinook by tattoo (on the inner thigh) or microchip.

Periodically, and upon any significant change in this Chinook's health, Purchaser will report the health of this Chinook to the Breeder. For example, Breeder must be informed if a male Chinook does not develop two descended testicles. Purchaser shall also report the death, and cause thereof, of this Chinook to the Breeder.
